Example Roundtable Discussion Topics

People and passwords are the biggest risk to an organisation's brand/future/intellectual property. Discuss

Enterprise Password Management (EPM) is progressing to Identity as a Service encompassing multi-factor authentication (MFA) as well as single sign-on (SSO). Discuss

Companies are struggling with security compliance as an ever-increasing number of apps are used by their staff. While some of these apps might be secured via SSO, there's a growing grey area of cloud apps outside the typical SSO environment that puts many organisations at serious risk of breach. Discuss

Forrester states that, of enterprise organisations that have suffered at least one data breach attributed to an external attack, cybercriminals used stolen user creds to carry out 31% of the attacks. Agree?

How to identify and mitigate data-related risks, without disruption to cloud? Discuss

Proactively managing security and avoiding security breaches is a fundamental in every business today. What level of staffing and what skills must those staff have if this function is to be effective?

What do you see as the biggest risks around EPM, SSO and MFA going forwards and what would you like to see your security applications vendors provide as functionality to address these areas in the future?

EPM, SSO and MFA are fundamental parts of overall IT Security, but there are many other parts too. Is it realistic for organisations to take a DIY (Do It Yourself) approach to all these areas or is it better to have a specialist security company manage these for you?
